Notification of Planned Burning

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) will be conducting a planned burn in your area as part of our bushfire risk reduction strategy. Planned burning is a controlled, low-intensity fire used to reduce natural fuel loads such as dry vegetation. This helps lower the risk of severe bushfires and supports healthy ecosystems by maintaining habitat diversity and protecting native species. By managing fuel levels, DFES aims to protect life, property, and natural resources from the impacts of wildfire.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO IF SMOKE AFFECTED:

- Motorists are advised to slow down, turn on headlights and follow signage instructions
- Residents should stay inside, close all windows and doors, and turn off air conditioners
- Individuals with health conditions aggravated by smoke should follow their prearranged treatment plan and take necessary precautions

WHAT YOU SHOULD NOT DO:

- Please do not call '000' unless reporting a life-threatening event
- Do not enter the reserve until deemed safe and all signage / hazard tape is removed

FURTHER INFORMATION

- The area will be monitored following the burn to ensure it is safe
- The area may smoulder for several days
